Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2014

Mission Statement: Eagle Mount Bozeman is committed to provide quality therapeutic recreational opportunities for people with disabilities or cancer, and to provide support for families of participants so that "they shall mount up with wings as eagles." (Isaiah 40:31)

Programs offered (Fiscal Year 2013 - 2014):

- Adaptive Skiing
 - o Bridger Ski-eight week alpine ski program at Bridger Bowl
 - Big Sky Ski—season-long adaptive skiing at Big Sky, Moonlight Basin, and Yellowstone Club
 - o Cross-country Skiing and Snowshoeing at Bohart Ranch
- Therapeutic Horsemanship held year round at the Eagle Mount Bozeman Cyndi Fonda Dabney Riding Arena
 - o 32 weeks of Therapeutic Horsemanship
 - o 2 one-week horsemanship camps
 - o 10 week spring Special Olympics Equestrian training
 - o Includes therapeutic riding, sport/skill riding, mini horse experience
 - o Supports 14 weeks of Hippotherapy offered by cooperating therapists
 - o Hosts two PATH On-Site Workshop and Certification sessions
- Ice Skating (October November) at Haynes Pavilion
- Aquatic Therapy
 - o Held at Eagle Mount's Tim and Mary Barnard Aquatic Center
 - o Classes scheduled to meet specific needs
 - o Young At Heart Senior therapy program
- Adventure Days
 - 8 week session offering a wide variety of adaptive sports for participants with developmental disabilities
 - o Cycling staff supported destination rides for independent riders
- Big Sky Kids (camps for young people with cancer and their families)
 - o Spring Fling family ski weekend at Big Sky Resort
 - o Adventure Camp 10 day camp in late June for children (ages 11 18) and one parent, held at Buck's T-4 Lodge
 - o Camp Braveheart -for children ages 5 10 and their families
 - o Young Adult Retreat for individuals ages 16–23 who have had cancer
- Horticulture weekly, February September
- Saturday Night Out monthly respite program for families of participants age 13 to 22
- Kids' Night Out monthly respite program for families of participants age 5 to 12

Funding: Eagle Mount is funded exclusively through private funds; we do not accept government funding. Our fees are very modest, and we never turn anyone away if they cannot pay. We are grateful beyond measure to the individuals, foundations, and businesses who make a difference in the world by supporting our work.

Regions Served: Our programs are open to anyone who qualifies, regardless of their place of residence. Sixty-five percent of our participants come from Bozeman and the surrounding area, 20% are from elsewhere in Montana, and 15% are from all over the U.S.

Facilities: Eagle Mount Bozeman's 19-acre campus includes a Therapeutic Horsemanship Center, an Aquatic Therapy Center, a greenhouse and accessible gardens. Winter sports programs are held at our partner ski areas: Bridger Bowl, Big Sky, Moonlight Basin, Bohart Ranch, and the Yellowstone Club. Rafting, kayaking, and fly fishing take place on the Gallatin, Yellowstone, Madison, and Jefferson Rivers.
