### Winter Art Show

On March 8th, the Mary Peterson Community Room at Eagle Mount was transformed into an art gallery. Drawings of plants, dinosaurs, apples, and dogs adorned the walls. An elaborate castle, an erupting volcano, and a playable guitar all made of cardboard were on display. Participants beamed with pride as they showed off their artwork to their family and friends.

This Winter Art Show, the first at Eagle Mount, marked the end of a 7-week Adaptive Arts session, in which participants, with the guidance of volunteers, learned to draw in pencil and sculpt with cardboard.

In Drawing 101, participants learned the fundamentals of drawing through a variety of fun exercises each week. Starting with basic shapes – rectangles, triangles, and ovals – we built objects like flowers, butterflies, and dinosaurs. We tried adding faces and contour lines to make our drawings look more 3-dimensional too. We practiced the difficult skill of seeing an object in front of us and then sketching it, starting with those basic shapes and adding details as we go. All of these new skills came together when we completed our final drawings of a still-life of plants. When asked about her favorite things to draw, participant Sierra's response was short and simple: "hearts!"

In Cardboard Construction, participants' imagination led the way. Special tools made specifically for cardboard enabled participants to cut, fold, and attach pieces into anything they could imagine. The "SafeSaw" has serrated edges that perfectly slice cardboard, but are safe to touch. The "FoldRoller" perforates cardboard to make clean folds anywhere they're needed. The "Scrudriver" comes with reusable 3d-printed screws that can attach two or three pieces of cardboard together. With these tools, the possibilities are endless, meaning participants were able to turn a few Amazon boxes, cereal cartons, and toilet paper rolls into playhouses, animals, mythical creatures, robots, furniture, decorative sculptures, and even wearable costumes. A favorite was Jarrod and Dirk's submarine, equipped with a spinning propeller and periscope.

Ziplining is just one of the many exciting activities awaiting participants this summer. Thank you to our partners at AMB West Basecamp for opening their high ropes courses to Eagle Mount each year.

Ziplining begins as participants gather at Eagle Mount in the early morning hours and depart to AMB West Basecamp. Upon arrival at the trailhead, participants take the 10-minute hike up Moose Track Trail, greeted with panoramic views of towering mountains and lush forests. Climb on!

The real excitement begins as participants gear up for their ziplining journey. Suspended high above the ground, thrill seekers are treated to an adrenaline-pumping 300+ ft ride. Crisscrossing Moose Tracks Gully while being nearly 50ft off the ground offers breathing views of the surrounding Paradise Valley.

In addition to fun and adrenaline filled activities, Adventure Days are all about inclusion and accessibility. "We believe that everyone should have the opportunity to experience the joy of outdoor adventure," says Addi, our Adventure Days organizer. "That's why we're proud to offer adaptive equipment and



support to ensure that individuals of all abilities can participate."

Cardboard Construction participants also considered design-thinking challenges posed by various Eagle Mount staff. Syvel designed a slow-feed dog bowl for one staff member's hungry pet, and Hayes built a massage chair to relieve his back ache. One staff member, Pearl, lamented collecting poopy eggs from her chicken coop, so participant Phoenix invented an "Egg-scalator," in which a freshly lain egg rolls down a chute to a padded collecting tray, free of contaminants. Faced with a similar problem of yummy apples falling from trees and getting bruised, Phoebe designed an apple trampoline to provide a softer landing.

At the Winter Art Show, the best thing about art was evident: that given the exact same materials, instruction, and time, each person creates something completely unique. At Eagle Mount, we believe that taking part in the arts encourages creativity, nurtures independence,

develops social skills, boosts confidence, and gives folks an outlet for communicating thoughts and emotions in a supportive setting. Whether it's drawing, cardboard sculpture, theater, dance, or painting, Eagle Mount will always provide a safe space for participants to explore. This Winter Art Show was our first, but definitely not our last!
