What is Digger Days?

Digger Days features over 40 pieces of heavy construction equipment. Kids of all ages will be able to climb into the cab (with operators), operate the controls, and move piles of rocks or dirt.

For everyone's safety no pets allowed.

When is Digger Days 2018?

Saturday, August 25th from 9am to 4pm.

Where is Digger Days?

Digger Days is held at the TGravel Pit on Dollar Drive off Frontage Road in Belgrade.

How much does the event cost?

Tickets are \$5 per person, and include a full day pass for all activities.

What is an appropriate age to attend?

Digger Days offers something for every age. The younger kids get more help from the operators than the older kids. Static pieces of equipment are also available for people to climb on, push buttons, honk horns and explore. There are playgrounds that include a pipe crawl, tire climb and a large dirt mound for unassisted playing and digging. Local mines provide stepping stone and garnet digging activities. The local fire department, city street division, search and rescue, highway patrol, police department and ambulance also participate and share their vehicles and educational materials.

What should I wear and bring?

Digger Days takes place at a pit that has been mowed and has some uneven ground. Therefore, closed-toed shoes are recommended. Sunscreen is also a good idea.

Will there be food and drinks?

Yes, food and drinks are available for purchase. Family style seating under a tent is also available.

Do you need volunteers?

Yes we need volunteers and we would love your help! Eagle Mount is asking that each volunteer works a minimum of a two-hour shift. Time blocks range between 8:30am to 4:30pm. Please contact Stephanie Uter at 406-586-1781 for more information.
